# Peters Earns Degree Thanks To EF Career Grant

Marian J. Peters, an EF career development grant recipient, was the featured speaker at the AAUW NC EF Breakfast. After the breakfast, she was invited to speak at the Statesville Branch banquet.

Marian, an associate professor of physics at Appalachian State University, has a bachelor's degree in math and physics, and a doctorate in physics. She told the branch about her two-year leave to get a physician's assistant degree from Wake Forest and her May 16 graduation. Marian spoke about her desire to get the new degree, in order to pursue her special interests in the areas of poverty and health care equity.

She also spoke about her strong support of the current and controversial issue, women in science.

Born in the USA, Marian grew up in India, where her father was a hospital administrator. Even as a very small child, she realized how blessed she was and how many people were hungry, sick, and in poverty. She has basically spent her life trying to help people. Her physician's assistant degree is not to change professions from a professor to a doctor, but to allow her to spend her own time working in clinics where indigent people come for medical care.

A portion of Marian's EF grant sponsorship funding came from the Statesville Branch Enola G. Retherford Grant. Additionally, she was funded by other North Carolina grants, including the North Carolina Golden Anniversary, Adelaide and Elizabeth Johnson, and the Beth Norris Grants.

#### **Directions:**


To the hotel from the east (Raleigh): Take I-40 to Exit 278 (Apex/Hwy. 55). At the stop light, the hotel is directly across the street.

To the hotel from the west (Greensboro): Take I-40 to Exit 278 (Apex/Hwy. 55). At the stop light, make a left and go one block. The hotel will be at the first stop light on your right.

### To UNC-TV:

If coming from the west (the hotel or Chapel Hill/ Greensboro), do NOT exit at 279A, Alexander Drive continue to 279B.

- Take I-40 to Exit 279B (Durham Freeway/ Hwy. 147 North).
  [From the hotel, take I-40 towards the airport and Raleigh.]
- Take the second exit (Alexander Drive).
- Turn left at the traffic light at the top of the exit ramp.
- Cross over the bridge and take the second right (approximately .5 mile).
- At this point, you should see signs for UNC-TV.
