We need all you old "girl scouts" (as well as branch members) to "be prepared" by having your Branch Banners up front and ready for the grand entry on Saturday morning of the AAUW-NC 75th convention.

Each branch should have received a 10" PVC pipe through the mail (if you didn't get it at the Fall Board Meeting) for the banner stand, along with complete instructions for making the banner, pole, rod, and flag stand. The design on the banner will be what makes your branch unique. It should include:

- Branch name and charter date
- How You Define Yourself, i.e., project in community you are known for or plan to do
- What your region is known for

You may decorate the rest in a manner that would tell others about "you."

Hopefully, you will get your banner made so that it can be used even before convention. Please take a picture of the banner with those who created it. Also, we will have a "drawing" for those submitting pictures of their banners being used at community events.

Be sure to designate one branch member to carry the banner. She should report to the registration desk by 8 a.m. on March 16.
