If the bylaws were clarified to allow two people to share one position on the board, how should the policies be clarified with respect to reimbursement of expenses?

- 1. reimburse the person who incurs the expenses
- 2. Reimburse the person who attends the meeting.
- <u>3.</u> If only one of them attends the meeting they should receive the dmount due one person and if both are there, they share the amount due one person.
- 4. Don't quite know how to reimburse that's fair yet. Needs more discussion
- 5. In our branch we have had co-presidents only when nobody would take the office otherwise. Not too efficient but a good emergency measure to get us over a bump.
- **<u>6.</u>** The persons sharing the position could decide between themselves who will attend a particular meeting. The rules could state that they would alternate their attendance to meetings except the state convention.
- <u>7.</u> This should be decided on a case by case basis by the treasurer and president. We think there is a need to be flexible.
- 8. otherwise you'd be doubling expenses. They could alternate trips to the Board meetings.
- 9. Prefer to limit to 1 person, but make arrangements for sometimes reimbursing 2 people.
- <u>10.</u> The two people should take turns representing the position at a meeting, and therefore be reimbursed for that time. (One person per time.)
- 11. As I remember the nominating committee has trouble enough finding one person for each job let alone two.
- **12.** specify amount for one attendee, or for two
- 13. 11. The operative word is "allow." It should not be mandated. 12. One person can give the reports at Board Meetings they may alternate or decide which person. 14. I am not really sure, since I suggested a regrouping of the committees. I tend toward reimbursement for one person to be shared between two. Co-chairs and Co-officers are helpful if the job is very demanding.
- 14. and then let them decide if they want to split that amount
- **15.** Reimbursement should be available to only one person; co-persons should alternate attendance or select the person most likely to travel to meetings.
- **16.** This question should be referred to the finance committee once it becomes clear whether or not using co-chairs of some committees and eliminating other positions would affect the number of people eligible for reimbursement. A whole new way of looking at that might be needed.
